You give survivors the chance to heal

Mary is a 30-year-old Hispanic single mother of two. Originally from South America, Mary arrived in the U.S. with a trusted aunt who promised a work visa, job, and help. After escaping family violence, sexual abuse, and abandonment by her parents in South America, all Mary desired was a safer and better life for her children, just like any of us would.

The work visa never appeared, and Mary and her children ended up sharing a house with 17 other people: food, space, and toilets were severely limited. Mary and her young children were forced to work all day and night for a family connected to her aunt. The family did not pay her and took everything from her.

Mary and her children were caught in a labor trafficking situation right here in a Dallas neighborhood. She didn't speak English nor understand her rights; and

when her own family started threatening her if she tried to leave, she sought out the police.

Thanks to Mosaic's partnership with local law enforcement, Mary and her children landed safely at Mosaic House where she was safe and received counseling and legal services. Her children were enrolled in school, and they engaged in all the youth activities and counseling offered at Mosaic House. All these services and activities helped the family begin to process and heal from the abuse and trafficking they went through.

The day Mary moved to her own apartment through Mosaic's transitional housing program she shared a thank you letter and drawing from a counseling session. "This drawing I did in my counselor's workshop. She has helped me a lot with her expertise and empathy".

We have been swooning over our fellow Texan, Simone Biles, and the Women's Gymnastics team! From dominating the world stage to inspiring millions with their resilience and grace, Team USA are true champions in every sense of the word!

Simone Biles isn't just a gymnastics legend; she's a beacon of resilience and strength. Seeing Simone compete is truly amazing; she takes on any challenge with courage and grace both on and off the mat. Although we are awestruck by Simone's brilliance and talent in the Olympics, we are even more inspired by the way she bravely advocates for herself and other survivors.

In 2016, Simone and hundreds of other gymnasts came forward about the sexual abuse they endured as children by gymnastics programs across the United States. Until that point, the abusers never faced any repercussions for their actions. In fact, many institutions meant to protect gymnasts were aware of the abuse happening but did nothing to stop it.

Survivors of abuse face overwhelming obstacles when fighting for justice and upholding their dignity. Standing up for yourself and speaking out about the injustices you've endured is terrifying and retraumatizing, and sometimes it's easier to stay quiet. It shouldn't have to be that way. Survivors shouldn't have to fight so hard for justice or accountability.

The long, tiring journey to healing and justice hasn't deterred Simone. She knew that systems needed to be held accountable to prevent abuse from happening again. She bravely stood up to those systems and valiantly demanded change.

survivors and for your steadfast determination to hold systems accountable.
